I have served as an election official in New Hampshire for more than forty years, as a Moderator, election observer and participant in numerous recounts (including one of my own). During that forty year period, Granite State elections have been fundamentally free from individual voter fraud. Our Secretary of State says that "worries" about voter fraud justify changes to our voting laws. But anxiety about rampant voter fraud is a product of massive misinformation spread by one political party as part of an effort to suppress the vote. Our democracy will not survive if large numbers of voters are denied their access to the franchise. Our political institutions should be figuring out how to get more people to vote, by things like early voting, automatic registration, making holidays of voting days, and guaranteeing that our electronic voting systems are secure and capable. I have worked as an election Poll Worker in California for the last few years. It's something I enjoy doing and take seriously. I am also a naturalized citizen. I feel that it's a great privilege to participate as a voter and that this privilege should not be taken lightly.

Some commendable efforts I see is as follows:

- 1) Training of Poll Workers is very detailed with handouts that are helpful and trainers that are knowledgable
- 2) The Elections office does a good job in making sure precincts have all the materials they need in an organized manner
- 3) Election Office Support staff try to do a good job in assisting Poll Workers during elections.

## Areas of concern:

- 1) Rosters have errors and have names of deceased voters or voters no longer living in the area. On both of these instances, I have had voters, upon signing into vote, point out to me these errors when they have knowledge of the person on roster. Some have been out of area or deceased for years, according to some of the comments I've received.
- 2) It's my opinion that too many provisional voting ballots are issued, especially during the last election.
- 3) There are voters that, even though not required in California, show their ID which I find to be very helpful and reassuring that they are the right person. I've also received comments from voters that showing an ID should be required to ensure voting integrity.
- 4) Although most Poll Workers try to do a good job, I've observed that there have been instances where Poll Workers were too lax and or not able to do a good job due to lack of ability i.e. unable to focus on task for a period of time.
- 5) I've also observed individuals brought in by others to vote who did not appear to be aware of the process or what or who they were voting for. In some instances they were very limited in their ability to speak English.

It appeared that the people who brought them in were there to try and coach them.

6) The area that I live in California does not have computerized ballots. At the end of the election paper ballots are put in cardboard boxes and taken to drop off location. It seems that there must be a more secure way to handle this, even though 2 Poll Workers are assigned to turn ballots in.

It appears to me, the CA Election Code not only does not protect against election fraud, but facilitates it.

I have attached a MS Word file with comments on what I think are the worst parts of the Code.

I have served as a Poll Worker and for several years have acted as a Poll Observer in San Diego County.
Generally speaking, most Poll Workers try to do a good job. However, I have seen numerous violations of the Election Code repeatedly year after year. I have reported these violations, but they keep occurring.

Two of the most frequent violations I have observed are:

Lack of privacy for the voter. Voting booths are often set up so anyone walking by can observe a voter. Sometimes I have seen booths set up so someone in another voting booth can look over at another voter. I have also seen several people sitting side by side at a table voting.

One of the few ways to try to prevent voter fraud is the requirement that Poll Workers ask voters for their name and address. Unfortunately, many Poll Workers ask for the voter?s name. They then tell the voter the address they have for them and ask if it is correct.

Those government ids should be issued in such a way to easily identify that they are only for driving and not for voting or other citizen proofs.

We need severe penalties for those that do this. As a poll observer I found many inconsistencies in voting procedures in different precincts throughout San Diego County in CA.

- 1. The poll worker is to ask the voter to tell him his full name and address. That forces the voter to actually tell an out and out lie out loud. Most people don't really want to do that. The poll workers do not ask the voter to do that. Instead, the voter walks in and says he is John Smith. The poll worker looks for him on his list. Then the poll worker does one of two things. He says "Ok, I found you," and gives him a ballot. Or the poll worker might say, "On blank street?" And the voter will say yes or nod yes. He gets a ballot.
- 2. California does not require a pictured ID which is so wrong. One voter presented his driver's license as verification of his ID. Instead of graciously looking at it and thanking the voter for presenting ID, the poll worker just dismissed it and said, "We don't need that."
- 3. Poll workers often allow a voter to vote regular way when they should be given a provisional ballot. You don't want to correct them in front of the voter, but sometimes you just have to. If the voter says he didn't receive his vote by mail ballot, he can only vote provisionally, but lots of poll workers give them a regular ballot. If the mail ballot has been voted already, and the voter is given a regular ballot, he is actually voting twice. This voter may or may not have voted the mail ballot himself. REDACTED, anyone can go online without proof of ID and can change the mailing address of a voter. That way a stranger gets the voter's ballot and votes by mail. Then the voter goes to the polls and votes regular way there. His vote is thereby actually counted twice. The US Post Office found 150 vote by mail ballots with different names on them all at the same address.
- 4. Now in California illegal immigrants are hired as poll workers. They are not citizens. They have not pledged allegiance to the California or the federal constitutions. There is a language barrier in a situation where even American poll workers have trouble following the laws correctly. We have had very high unemployment rates in recent years, and Americans needed those jobs. It is well documented that California has adequate numbers of trained poll workers available to work and that there is no need for illegal immigrants to be hired. So why are they???
- 5. **REDACTED**, volunteers with EIP cross referenced voter lists with social security records to determine how many deceased voters were still on active voting rolls. We could not remove them from the voting rolls as we did not have authority to do that. We could only report it. We also noted how many registered voters were living at the same address. If that number seemed excessive, some one

went to that address to see if was possible for that many registered voters to be living at that address Maybe the address was actually a commercial building or an empty lot. Maybe it was a very tiny house with 10 registered voters living there. Was that probable and/or possible?
I will document other actual observations in a separate email.

My wife and I moved from Arizona to California to care for her aging, ailing parents. Her father died within two months of colon cancer. Her mother remained with us for an additional three years before dying of Lewie Body Disease complications.

In the mean time we had taken my aunt into our home as she was in her nineties, legally blind, and physically challenged. Following her death (which was properly reported to relevant authorities) we received the absentee ballot she had signed up for at the next election. We took the ballot to the voting place near our home and turned it in, reporting that she was deceased.

At the next election she received another absentee ballot, which we again turned in at the nearby voting location and reported her death. At the next election, now more than four years after her death, she received another absentee ballot.

Does no one make note of deceased voters? How many times will my deceased aunt receive an absentee ballot before someone takes note of her death? It is not very reassuring that election records are not updated in a timely manner. We can't help but wonder how many people are able to vote multiple times because they continue to receive absentee ballots for deceased loved ones.

For the last five years I have volunteered at polling places in REDACTED. A large percentage of people use vote by mail ballots. In fact our Democratic Governor and the Democratic supermajority Senate and House are attempting to go to all mail ballots. The problem is the majority of the people who came to the polling places to vote did so because their absentee ballots never arrived at their home addresses. # Statement by Senator Jeanne Shaheen Before the Presidential Advisory Commission on Election Integrity Manchester, NH September 12, 2017

Vice Chair Kobach and members of the commission: With the Senate in session, I am unable to attend today's hearing, but I appreciate this opportunity to submit testimony for the record.

On February 9, President Trump asserted that he would have been victorious in the Granite State if not for thousands of people who were bussed into New Hampshire to vote illegally on Election Day. Two weeks earlier, the president said that he lost the popular vote because three to five million people voted illegally. He offered no evidence to support either of these very serious allegations; nor has anyone else. Nonetheless, the president used these claims to justify creating this commission, whose obvious purpose is to lay the groundwork for broad-scale voter suppression laws. Some legislators in Concord have used the same unsubstantiated claims to justify passing new laws making it more difficult to vote in New Hampshire.

Last Thursday, on the far-right website *Breitbart*, the vice chair of this commission used deceptive and irrelevant data to rehash the same false claims that have been debunked time and again by independent analyses and by members of both major parties here in the Granite State. Using slippery words like "it has been reported" and "anecdotally," the vice chair insinuates that thousands of same-day registrants used out-of-state driver's licenses to prove identity and vote illegally. I say "insinuates" because he offers no actual evidence — not a single confirmed case of fraudulent voting. He made no effort to contact voters who had cast ballots but held out-of-state driver's licenses.

The fact is that New Hampshire law clearly states that citizens who live in New Hampshire can vote without a New Hampshire ID. This includes long-time New Hampshire residents who don't drive and don't have a driver's license; it includes thousands of students from other states who live in New Hampshire while attending school; and it includes military personnel from other states who live in New Hampshire while on active duty.

Granite Staters are not gullible or naive, and we do not appreciate those who impugn the integrity of our state's voting systems based on unsubstantiated accusations. Indeed, the vice chair's accusations in *Breitbart* call into question the legitimacy of our elections in New Hampshire for every federal, state, and local office. This is reckless and irresponsible.

The truth is that, here in New Hampshire and across the nation, voter fraud is extremely rare. I am deeply concerned that falsehoods about illegal voting are being spread as a pretext for restricting access to the ballot box. This risks disenfranchising eligible voters and undermining faith in our democracy.

There is zero evidence of significant voter fraud in the Granite State during the 2016 election. Senior Deputy Secretary of State David M. Scanlan, head of the Election Division, said: "There are some isolated instances of individual voters voting improperly. . . But we haven't had any complaints about widespread voter fraud taking place." Meanwhile, the nonpartisan Brennan Center for Justice has determined that voter fraud happens nationwide as little as 0.00004 percent of the time. A separate, multiyear study by Justice Department senior official Justin Levitt found only 31 credible allegations of voter fraud out of one billion votes cast between 2000 and 2014.

Granite Staters take pride in our state's brand of open and direct democracy, which encourages maximum participation, including by college students and active-duty members of the military who live in our state. It is not the New Hampshire way to make voting unnecessarily difficult or to target specific groups of voters with deliberately onerous ID laws.

I am very concerned that reckless accusations of widespread voter fraud and illegitimate elections in New Hampshire could jeopardize our state's first-in-the-nation presidential primary. Every four years, activists from other states attempt to take away our first-in-the-nation primary, and they will now quote the vice chair of this commission. This is deeply unfortunate and a disservice to the people of New Hampshire.

We must learn from ill-conceived voter ID laws in other states. Striking down the laws passed by the Republican majority in North Carolina's legislature, a unanimous federal court ruled that they "target African Americans with almost surgical precision" and "impose cures for problems that did not exist." Invalidating similar laws in Wisconsin, U.S. District Judge James Peterson wrote: "The Wisconsin experience demonstrates that a preoccupation with mostly phantom election fraud leads to real incidents of disenfranchisement, which undermine rather than enhance confidence in elections, particularly in minority communities."

When candidate Donald Trump claimed that the election would be "rigged," and when President Trump claimed that the electoral process has been massively corrupted by millions of illegal votes, these false assertions have real consequences. They undermine confidence in our elections and democracy, and create a dishonest rationale for voter-suppression laws targeting the poor, the young and minorities.

At the end of the Constitutional Convention in 1787, a citizen asked Benjamin Franklin: "Well, doctor, what have we got – a republic or a monarchy." He famously answered: "A republic, if you can keep it." Fortunately, the great majority of Americans reject falsehoods that discredit our democracy and disenfranchise voters. We still have a robustly democratic republic. And we intend to keep it.
