

Statement from Acting OMB Director Russ Vought:

Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled "Coordinating National Resilience to Electromagnetic Pulses"

This executive order requires relevant agencies to coordinate the development and implementation of executive branch actions to assess, prioritize, and manage the risks of electromagnetic pulses (EMPs), among other things. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of this executive order include fostering sustainable, efficient, and cost-effective approaches to improving the Nation's resilience to the effects of EMPs. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-fiscal year period beginning in fiscal year 2019. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order include the Departments of State, Defense, the Interior, Commerce, Energy, and Homeland Security, the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, and the Executive Office of the President.
